





## **Answers:** Identify the following trends and complete each sentence:



Between 2002 and 2004, the amount of oil produced in Canada rose sharply to a peak of 70 million barrels, and then from 2006 to 2011, it remained the same at approximately 38 million.




From 2001 to 2005, the number of barrels fluctuated from around 5 million in 2001 to about 60 million in 2005. Then, between 2005 and 2010, there was a steady drop to approximately 45 million.




In 2002, the amount of oil stood at 20 million barrels, after which it increased slightly to around 27 million in 2008.


Between 2008 and 2010, there was a sharp increase to approximately 75 million barrels.




From 2001 to 2003, the number of barrels dropped sharply from 70 million to around 10 million. Next, the number went up steadily to about 30 million between 2003 and 2011.




In 2001, the number of barrels stood at 20 million, and then it remained the same until 2006. Following that, the number peaked at around 70 million in 2007.



Between 2001 and 2007, there was a gradual decrease from 60 million barrels to around 55 million. Then, from 2007 to 2011, there was a fluctuation from around 55 million to about 35 million.



During 2003 there was a dramatic decrease to approximately 2 million barrels. However, in the following year, it rose rapidly back to 70 million, after which the number remained the same until 2010.



In 2002, there was a sharp increase to a plateau at 70 million barrels. Next, it decreased moderately to around 55 million between 2006 and 2011.
